## PASTOR MIKE'S LETTER:

As we begin the season of Lent, we dedicate time to be disciplined in our faith. We focus on person growth and deeper connections with God. I want to also invite you to reflect on a few more of the 8 steps for church growth that were introduced last month. I ask that you keep our church in your prayers this Lenten Season, as we strive to be a good witness at this time and in this place.

#### 4. Care for Church Members

Church members are one of the key customer groups in a church. Understanding their unique needs and ensuring their needs are met – within the scope of the vision – is critical to church growth. For example, if the church has volunteer opportunities, make sure the application and communication process is a good experience. If a volunteer is given a job or a responsibility, try to make sure they know what is expected of them. Provide them with what they need in order to do their job. The goal is to provide support for their needs. Having said that, there are people who sometimes make unreasonable demands for things that don't line up with the vision or strategy of the church. This can be difficult to deal with. There was a pastor who once said he would respond to this kind of person with "either love me or leave me but don't stay here and fight me…" Some people are unreasonable and you need to just let them move on.

### 5. Provide Opportunities to Serve

At the core of all of us is a desire to serve others. Jesus did it, and as Christians, we need opportunities to help other people. Whether it is serving meals to the less fortunate, organizing mission trips, or helping others in a time of crisis – opportunities to serve offer members the chance to use their gifts to help God's people. A well-defined strategic plan can help identify the kinds of service opportunities that support the vision of the church.

As we reflect on these steps, we are also mindful that the church is made up of people who, Martin Luther explained, "are simultaneously saint and sinner." Friends, this means that sometimes we get it right, and other times we miss the mark. If we continue to prioritize care and offer opportunities for people to step up and serve, we can be that church that we hope for. Even more important, we can be that church that our communities need us to be.
